

You want to publish your latest article in open access? Great idea! Here's how to do it.

First, check your funder's and your institution's **mandate** on open access and self-archiving

Look for a journal that allows you to comply with these requirements

**Hybrid journal:** individual articles, on the author's request, are freely available on the journal's website from the moment they are published, while subscription to the journal as a whole is still subject to a fee.

**Full open access journal:** all articles are available in open access and there is no subscription fee for readers.

Is it a **full open access** journal?

Is it a **hybrid** journal?

Make sure that it is indexed in the [DOAJ](#) or that it is not in [Beall's list](#) of predatory publishers

Check how you'll pay for the **Article Processing Charges**, if any

Check that it has an adequate **license** (e.g. Creative Commons)

Select the gold open access option when submitting your article or upon acceptance by the publisher

Your article is available in open access on the journal's page!

Still, it is advised (maybe even required by your mandate) to archive it in an institutional repository.

You want to publish in Gold Open Access

You want to publish in Green Open Access

The journal's self-archiving policy **is incompatible** with your funder's / institution's requirements

The journal's self-archiving policy **is compatible** with your funder's / institution's requirements

Submit a **license to publish** (L2P) or an **addendum** to the copyright transfer agreement

The L2P or addendum **is rejected** by the publisher

The L2P or addendum **is accepted** by the publisher

**Self archive your article!**

Inform your librarians and your co-authors under which conditions they can post the article, and send them the version they can upload.
